Every year CMS 6th and 7th grade students are given the opportunity to go on an overnight trip to learn team building skills and deepen their relationship with God and their peers. CMS 8th grade students have the opportunity to attend an overnight leadership conference where they will grow in their spiritual walk with Jesus and learn leadership skills. These trips create lasting memories and will have a lifelong impact on their lives.

Every Spring CMS students take TerraNova achievement tests. When a 7th grader scores in the 95th percentile or higher in a core subject they qualify for Duke Tip and can take the ACT/SAT. An 8th grader who scores in the 95th percentile can qualify for the Joseph Baldwin Academy at Truman State University, an exciting college experience.

53% of our 7th graders qualified for Duke Tip Talent Search.
